


WORD ON THE STISEET NEW DAY Possibilities and Potential

It took me quite a long time to realize that God only uses imperfect, broken people. Maybe it was me trying to find an excuse for not serving but I had this habit of comparing myself to other Christians who I respected and did not see myself in the same light as them. But I remember hearing a preacher saying that if God only used perfect people, nothing would get done because perfect people don't exist! Okay, that makes sense, right? God gave Jonah a seven-word sermon: "In forty days Nineveh will be destroyed!" Jonah 3:4. That simple message led to

one of the largest spiritual revivals in history. A huge city humbly turned to God. It's really a bigger miracle than getting Jonah out of the belly of a big fish that we all know so well. That's how big and powerful our God is when He could use this imperfect, reluctant prophet to lead an incredible revival. I love the fact that God was patient with Jonah and never gave up on him. God never gave up on me and He won't give up on you either. The Bible says, "The Lord . . . is being patient for your sake. He does not want anyone to be destroyed, but wants everyone to repent" 2 Peter 3:9. The way I have tried to live my life is that if I wake up tomorrow morning, it will mean
